



New Hampshire CNA Certification Checklist

- Complete a state-approved training program with at least 75 education hours
- Have the school that provided the nursing program submit an official transcript or letter verifying completion of the Nursing Fundamentals Course within 5 years of the application date
- Complete criminal background check
- Complete an online application
- Pass the CNA competency exams within 2 years of the application date or complete at least 200 hours of nursing assistant-related activities under licensed nurse supervision within the 2 years preceding application

New Hampshire calls CNAs licensed nursing assistants (LNAs). The New Hampshire Office of Professional Licensure and Certification (OPLC) handles LNA licensing.
