



Vermont CNA Certification Checklist

- Complete a 75-hour State-approved nursing assistant program
- Use the Online Services Platform to complete an online application and pay non-refundable application fee
- Complete a Criminal Background Check
- Equivalent training
- Register with Excel Testing for NNAAP knowledge and skills tests

The Vermont Board of Nursing uses the licensed nursing assistant (LNA) title instead of CNA. LNAs may receive provisional licensure for up to 90 days while awaiting a criminal background check.
